

CORD WRAPS

This project is an oldie, but a goodie :) It's a great one, especially if you have young children who are attracted to cords (my son always went after long, exposed cords when he was a toddler, yikes!).

It is a really simple project, that you can make from things you already have on hand!

What you'll need:

Toilet paper rolls (however many you need)

Duck/Duct Tape*

Velcro

What you'll do:

1) Cover the toilet paper roll with duct/duck tape.



2) Cut the toilet paper roll to the length you would like it to be.



3) Cut it lengthwise.



4) Add some velcro



5) Wrap around cord.



**Side note: I've always wondered whether it's Duct tape or Duck tape, because I've heard both over the years. When writing this post, I decided to finally google it. I love google... Anyways, here's what's up. During WWII, Johnson and Johnson created a waterproof tape for the military to use to keep moisture out of their ammunition cases.
